- JESUS TELLS US HOW TO STOP COVETING- Lk 12:22-34
- 1. Stop two emotional responses
 - Stop worrying (worry repeated 4x, v 22,25,26,29)
 - Don't be afraid (v 32)
- 2. How-think, consider
 - Nature- ravens and lilies, God feeds & clothes (24, 27-28)
 - Logic- how little worry accomplishes (25-26)
 - Negative example- Pagans- worry and run (30)
- 3. Know- believe, trust
 - You are more valuable to God (24)
 - God will take care of you (28,30-31)
 - You are loved- little flock (32)
- 4. Positive action steps
 - Seek His kingdom (31)
 - Sell your possessions and give to the poor (33)
- 5. Focus on the promises
 - The Father knows your needs (30)
 - The Father will meet your needs as you seek His kingdom (31)
 - The Father is pleased to give you the kingdom (32)
 - Kingdom Heavenly treasure is secure- no thief or moth (33)
- 6. Final warning & promise- this has consequences
 - Your treasure leads your heart (34)- A spiraling loop that leads either up or down
 - The heart chooses the treasure, and the treasure changes the heart
