Washing	The Bronze Basin	Exodus 30:17-19

The Basin was situated between the Altar and the tabernacle, and was made from mirrors made to reflect, and of bronze (Judgement). What is the symbolism, and what is the result?

(Reflect)²³ For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man who looks intently at his natural face in a mirror.²⁴ For he looks at himself and goes away and at once forgets what he was like. ²⁵ But the one who looks into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and perseveres, being no hearer who forgets but a doer who acts, he will be blessed in his doing. James 1:23-25 (Good Judgement) ⁵ Examine yourselves, to see whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves.
