GETTING OUR FEET WET- how did the Africans feel about the Bible?

- Dt 5<sup>22</sup> These are the commandments the LORD proclaimed in a loud voice to your whole assembly there on the mountain from out of the fire, the cloud and the deep darkness; and he added nothing more. Then he <u>wrote</u> them on two stone tablets and gave them to me.
- Dt 6<sup>9</sup> <u>Write</u> them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates.
- Dt 17<sup>18</sup> When he takes the throne of his kingdom, he is to <u>write</u> for himself on a scroll a copy of this law, taken from that of the Levitical priests.
- Josh 1<sup>8</sup> Keep this <u>Book of the Law</u> always on your lips; meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything <u>written</u> in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful.
